As our Autumn term comes to an end, I would like to start by thanking you all for sending cards, gifts, emails of thanks and your ongoing support as our parent body; it is very much appreciated.

The Autumn term is always a long one in the school year and this one has certainly been action packed! It seems like a long time ago when our Year 5 cohort took part in their 3 day residential trip to Bushcraft; an experience that they will remember well. Our Harvest Festival was a lovely way to involve our children in the community. The Year 6 children represented our school extremely well and their ability to entertain our guests at their tables as well as on the stage was very well received by the visitors. As well as our key events that we have welcomed back, our staff have continued to bring the curriculum to life as much as possible through events such as the Planetarium visit and The Great Fire of Wheatcroft. We look forward to many more opportunities in the year ahead.

Our School Improvement Partner was able to visit us this term with a shared focus on PE across the school. His report was very positive and celebrated the amount of work that has gone into our PE curriculum and provision. "Practice seen shows that staff subject knowledge is strong and pupils make positive progress through the PE curriculum. Pupils were well behaved in PE lessons and were unfailingly polite to adults and held doors open for others without prompting. Feedback from pupils indicates that they have access to a wide range of extra-curricular clubs and inter-school sporting activities." Well done and thank you to Mrs Woodier and the staffing team for the commitment they show to providing these opportunities for all our children.

As a school we have thoroughly enjoyed our first 'proper' Christmas term since 2019 and know that all of the hard work gone into organising our Christmas events has truly been worth it as we have watched the excitement build and the joy on the children's faces. The children have thoroughly enjoyed getting into the festive spirit with Christmas dinner day, nativity plays from EYFS and KS1, the KS2 Christingle service, Christmas jumper day, decorations day and the PTFA Christmas Fair. It is hard to believe that for our younger children, our nativities would have been their first public performances; they made us all so proud. They shone with enthusiasm through their singing, dancing and performing, and it has been wonderful to be able to share this through live performances with you. Thank you so much to everyone on the Wheatcroft team who has put in so much extra effort to ensure the children are able to have these wonderful experiences.

Thank you to those of you who responded to our behaviour survey earlier in the term. We are extremely pleased to report that 100% of those surveyed stated that they agreed that their child felt safe at school. We have looked closely at the results which show that some of you have shared that you are unsure about your child's knowledge of keeping themselves safe online and online bullying. Every half term we have an online safety focus across the school to teach children about online safety at an age appropriate level. Online safety is also a key part of our IT and PSHE curriculum. We also send out online safety newsletters each term so do make sure you look out for these in our emails. During parent consultations, we have an online safety table for you to spend time browsing websites and resources. If you have any questions or concerns regarding online safety or online bullying please do speak with your class teacher. All online incidents are reported to our E-Safety lead Miss Brown.

As we come to the end of a very long and busy term I would like to take this opportunity to thank all members of our school community for their continued commitment and support towards educating the pupils of our school. Thank you so much to the Wheatcroft staff team for their commitment to our school; I am sure you will agree with me in wishing them a well-deserved restful and safe Christmas with their own families and friends. Reception 2



We have had great fun this Autumn Term. We learnt lots about the Great Fire of London and created our own artwork as well as having our own Great Fire of Wheatcroft.




















This term some of us also had the chance to practise our balancing skills as well as exploring different ways to travel and climb on the apparatus in PE.




Year 1/2





We have been exploring many exciting topics this term. Here are just a few examples of all the wonderful things we have achieved.





This term we have been writing instructions on how to make our own potion. We used adjectives and time conjunctions to make our instructions more interesting. In our Maths lessons, we have been learning how to tell the time using o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past.






In Geography, we looked at different types of weather and compared countries from around the world. Then, we looked at weather data from cities in the UK and discussed how they are similar or different. In Science, we planned our own investigation to explore suitable materials for a waterproof umbrella. 




Year 3/4




Year 3/4 class have had a fantastic term, settling well and enjoying a broad and exciting curriculum.

We have loved meeting our Reception buddies. We can't wait to spend more time with them in the New Year. We have been practising gymnastics in PE and loved using the apparatus.






It has been an incredible term in Year 5. It has been a non-stop few months and September seems like a distant memory.
