## Nursery



Nursery children have settled in to school life really well, quickly learning the routines of the classroom and making friends.

In Phonics they have been following Phase 1 of letters and sounds, where they've been developing their listening skills. Activities included going on a listening walk around the school, body percussion and exploring the sounds that different musical instruments make.

Nursery have been learning lots of rhyming songs and enjoyed World Nursery Rhyme Week where they did lots of activities linked to different rhymes.











In Maths, Nursery have been working on their understanding of number, knowing that numbers identify how many objects are in a set. They've also been learning the names and properties of 2-dimensional shapes.

Nursery worked hard learning the song Big Yellow Moon for the Foundation Stage production of The Bossy Kings. They also enjoyed watching a production company perform the pantomime 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears.'

We have been so busy this whole term, enjoying all of our topics, and learning inside and outside of the classroom.



### **School Council**






#### Year 3




#### Year 5
