Welcome to the Spring term! We hope you all had a wonderful time celebrating Christmas with your families and your children are ready for 2022 in Wheatcroft Foundation Stage.

This half term Nursery and Reception will be learning about 'Traditional Tales' from the Gingerbread Man, The Elves & The Shoemaker, The Snow Queen to The Three Little Pigs. The children will be exploring these stories through engaging in activities inside and outside the classroom.

Activities will include decorating gingerbread men, exploring cold climates when we read Snow Queen and making shoes out of junk modelling for the Elves. We will also be exploring these stories in our Forest School sessions, for example using positional language to find the big bad wolf from Little Red Riding Hood! We are looking forward to a fun packed term!

Happy New Year and welcome back to the new term; we hope you all had a relaxing and enjoyable holiday. We have a lot of exciting things planned for your children this term.

We will be looking at the life and legacy of Beatrix Potter, including reading her wonderful stories. We will also be exploring events that happen in the Jewish and Christian faiths.

We will be looking at the common plants found in our local environment and we will visit the forest school area. Following the plant theme we will be investigating and exploring art in our natural environment.



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In Music we will be learning to play the ocarina, a simple wind instrument, and exploring drumming. In Computing, we will explore how to make a simple algorithm on the program Scratch and we will be following instructions ourselves when we make healthy food, including vegetable quiches in Design & Technology.

The healthy theme continues into PSHE where we will be considering how to keep ourselves safe and healthy in different situations as well as thinking about our goals and dreams. Finally, in PE we will be outside for games (weather dependent) and inside for gymnastics.

As always, your child will need all their clothing and personal items named and PE kit, including trainers, in school every day.

We will continue to set spelling homework and to change reading books on the usual days. Thank you, in advance, for all your support.

Lower Key Stage 2

It has been a pleasure talking with the children finding out the fun activities they have been up to over the Christmas period.

In English, we will be reading the story 'Leon and the Place Between' for our unit 'Mystery and Suspense'. For our non-fiction unit, we will be using explanation texts linked to Wallace and Gromit and their unusual contraptions. Lastly, we will be investigating Haikus, Kennings and Tankas to produce our own poetry.

In Maths, each class will continue to explore the four operations with a focus on formal written methods and calculations. Building on previous knowledge, we will then begin to look at adding and subtracting fractions, the properties of shape, as well as perimeter and scaling.

We are excited to offer many cross-curricular opportunities, with examples such as our 'Electricity' topic spanning both science and design and technology. Children will learn the subject knowledge and apply it practically making their own circuit boards using a switch, light and buzzer.

Lastly, we look forward to performing in our end of term LKS2 production! An exciting term ahead for LKS2!

Welcome back to another busy term in UKS2. We hope everyone had a lovely Christmas break and a good rest after what was a very busy Autumn term.

To kick off our English, each class is practising their essay writing skills: Year 6 are writing about their future careers to enter the Rotary Club competition and Year 5 are reflecting on the best day of their lives; we look forward to reading their contributions.

Our topics this term are flooding in Geography; this will be complemented by a study of the book 'Floodland' by Marcus Sedgewick. In non-fiction, we will discuss the contentious topic of graffiti and consider whether it is vandalism or art and we produce our own designs in Art using different media as well as trying our hand at screen printing.

In History, we will look at the Victorians and will be studying 'Street Child' by Berlie Doherty to accompany this. In Maths, each class will continue with their learning journeys covering different areas such as shape, angles and more complex calculations.

We are also pleased to be working with Hertfordshire Constabulary with the Year 6 students on a 'mini police' project. All in all, there is a lot to keep us busy!
